Boom Lift Operator Training Tempe - A cherry picker refers to a kind of aerial work platform. Cherry pickers have a bucket or platform at the end of a hydraulic lifting system. The machine is also called a boom lift, man lift, basket crane or hydraladder.

The bucket of platform is occasionally mounted to or set unto a truck or other vehicle and is sometimes known as a bucket truck. Other vehicles which could be made use of are stand-alone trailers, self-moving platform or flat back pickup vans. The person working stands inside the bucket and works from there. The individual within the bucket usually comprises an upper set of controls allowing manipulation of the position of the bucket. The bucket's reach could be extended on various models by telescoping to be able to adjust the lifting arm. Automatic safety controls prevent tipping. Articulated boom lifts are recommended when it is required to clear obstacles or for working in tight areas.

Cherry pickers, as the name suggests, were originally made for picking fruit in trees at high levels. These machines are usually utilized in different industries like for instance construction, mining and exterior painting. Sometimes they are made use of for cleaning windows on high rise. The machines are utilized to service cable television, electrical equipment and telephone on utility poles. Fire fighters occasionally utilize cherry pickers, called snorkels, when ladders are not enough. At Christmas season, civic workers could be seen inside cherry pickers hanging banners and lights.
