Forklift Certification Schools Tempe - In North America, forklift certification is mandatory, making forklift training programs important for both the company and their employees working as forklift operators. Forklift training focuses on safety and health issues included in forklift use. Safety concerns affect both the forklift operator and workers and other individuals who are in close proximity to the forklift. Companies can be subject to penalties if they are caught with un-certified operators during an inspection. There are a lot of convincing reasons why businesses should follow forklift standards.

Before the employee or trainee is certified to operate a forklift, nearly all provincial, federal and state rules would need the worker go through an evaluation of the skills required for forklift safety. There are several forklift certification schools providing courses for workers and there are also schools which provide on-line forklift training. Then again, employers must know that forklift certification training is not "just a test". Correct forklift training must include some fields of study, including theory and hands-on practice. Rules do not need employers to have an outside organization to certify forklift drivers.

A quality forklift certification school would include a recommended program which comprises classroom training and hands-on training that is performed on-site. The training sessions within the classroom include power point presentations, videos, models and discussions. Students usually are needed to write a test to check for understanding of subject matter. Certificates of completion are given upon successfully finishing the class.

The use of the equipment evaluation needs the trainee to know the job site hazards, pre-operational equipment check, a pass/fail operational test and operational instruction.

The following subject areas would typically be covered in the training: Understanding regulations and legislations; Controls & Instrumentation; Engine maintenance and Operation; maneuvering and Steering; Visibility, Fork & Attachment Restrictions; Rated Capacities, Stability, Inspection & Maintenance; Load Manipulation; Refueling; Dangerous Places & Rough Terrain Operations and Pedestrians. Additionally, there are training courses offered for workers who are transitioning to new job positions.
