Forklift License Tempe - Acquiring a forklift certification or forklift license in North America will require the trainee to do hands-on training in addition to classroom instruction. The provincial, federal and state regulatory bodies are responsible for the licensing, certification and training for powered industrial truck operators. Operators may acquire a license either by a third party or through training administered by the employer. In any case, regulatory requirements need to be met. Recertification is necessary every two to three years.

Lift trucks are powered industrial trucks which come together with various options, such as stand-up and sit-down. There are different types and sizes of forklift suitable for different industrial uses. Operator training programs are often individualized to deal with the specific uses and kinds for which the operator is training. Training on a sit-down, gas-powered forklift in a warehouse surroundings would not be the same as training on a stand-up, propane-powered lift truck within a shipyard. The different lift trucks and their uses makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all industries and equipment. Regulatory standards, hence, have a tendency not to focus on detailed course requirements but rather on the results of individual training courses.

On the job training which is provided by the employer is the most common way of forklift training certification and licensing. The employer who provides this method of certification is needed to offer classroom sessions and practical training on machines at their place of work. Employers can choose to train staff on each and every kind of forklift separately, or to train them on all equipment combined. The course incorporates forklift operation methods, company policies, forklift maintenance and safety procedures. Subject matters particular to the worksite, like for example dangerous materials or conditions, should be covered. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely use and operate each kind of forklift on the worksite.

Certification through a third-party vendor usually needs an on-site component along with hands-on practice.

Normally, an employer-provided certification would not transfer from the current employer to the next employer. Acquiring a lift truck license through employer-provided training allows the operator to operate a lift truck for that particular employer only.

The most significant aspect of lift truck license training is forklift safety. The exact safety training requirements differ from one type of machine to another. Safety problems vary from employer to employer, and from industry to industry. Both employer-provided training and third-party providers might have to deal with additional requirements for safety training in applicable industries, like in marine and offshore uses.
